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I work at Mondragon University in the field of digital competence & online learning.

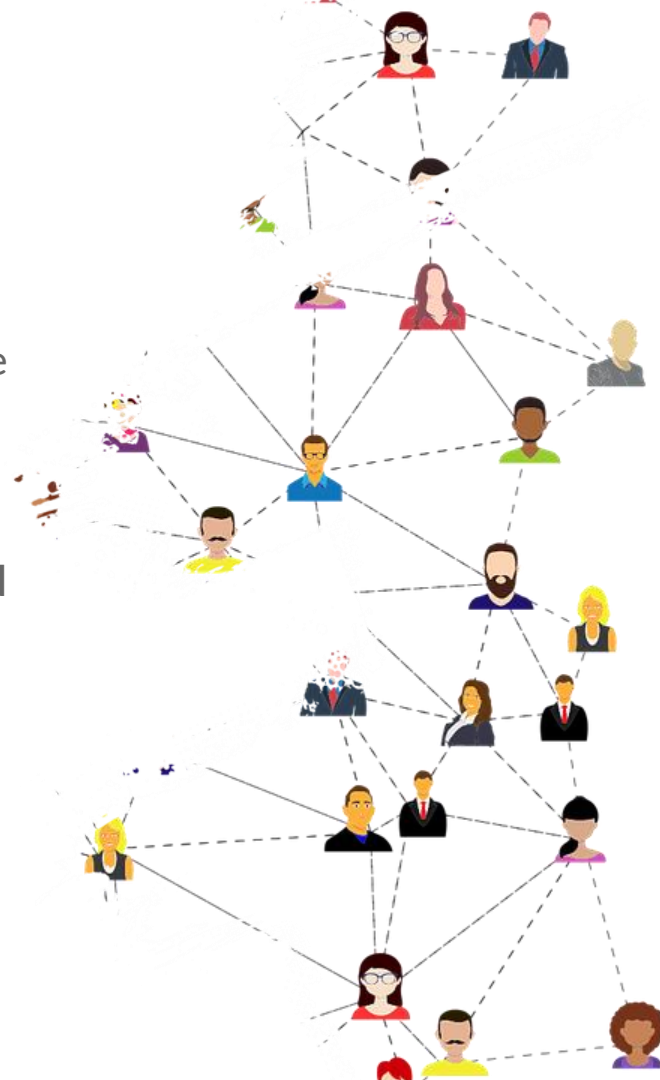
I train teachers in different faculties on those knowledge areas.

Concept of PLE by Graham Atwell



The idea of a Personal Learning Environment (PLE) recognises that...

- × learning is continuing and seeks to provide tools to support that learning
- × the role of the individual in organizing their own learning
- × the idea that learning will take place in different contexts and situations and will not be provided by a single learning provider. Linked to this is an increasing recognition of the importance of informal learning.

Learners...

- × **No longer necessarily locked into a particular course in order to gain a qualification** but are able to present their learning to prove they possess such competencies or are able to achieve those outcomes.
- × **Could select evidence and artefacts from the PLE for presentation for qualification purposes.** It is also important to note that formal qualifications are increasingly only seen as one aspect of competence, at least for employment purposes.
- × **Employers also increasingly wish to see evidence of the ability to apply skills and knowledge in a particular context.** PLEs could facilitate such presentations, in an extended form of an ePortfolio and through links to an e-Portfolio.



So... what is a PLE?

- × A new approach to "learning to learn" using **technological tools (media)**, **information sources (sites)** and **social networks (people) of interaction** (Personal Network of Learning PLN).
- × It is about learning throughout life through a solid digital competence, combining formal and informal learning.
- × It depends on the learner (skills, attitude...)

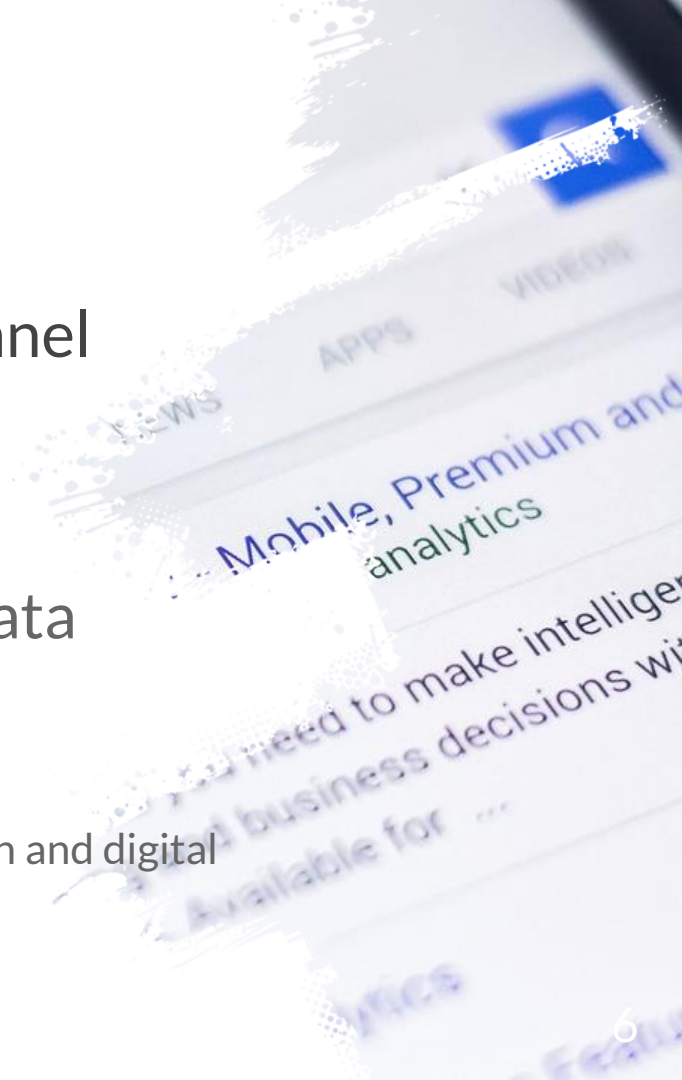

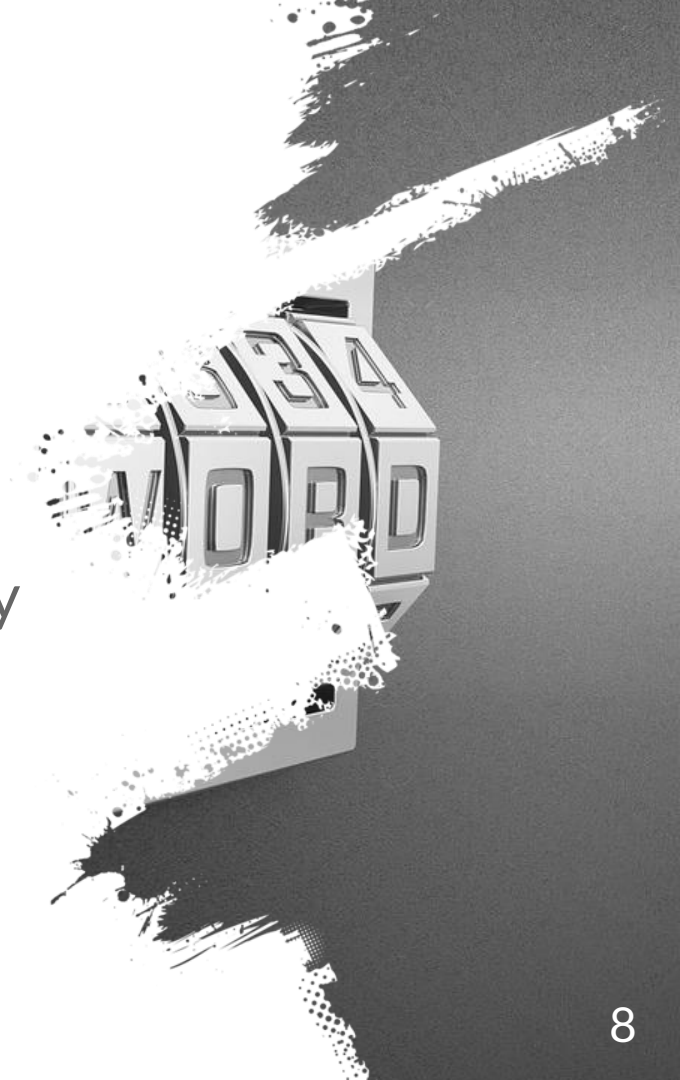

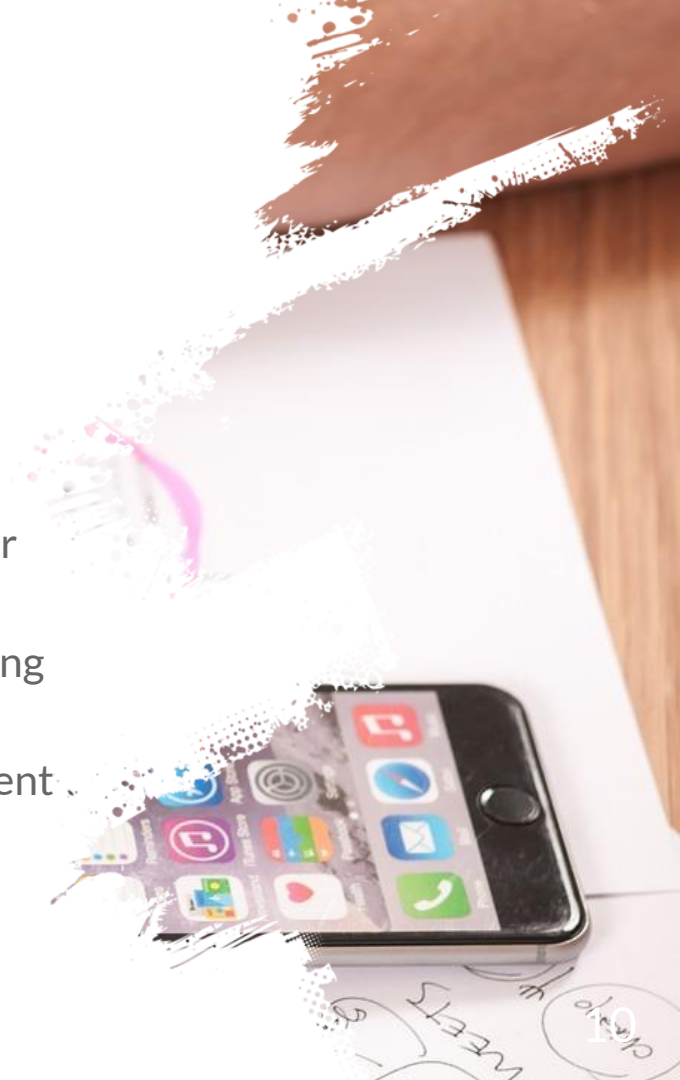

 - × Search strategies: Advanced & filtered searches
 - × Specialized searches (Twitter, YouTube, Slideshare...)
- × **Management / monitoring of sources and filtering of information:**
 - × RSS Readers: Feedly
 - × Personalized journals: Paper.li
 - × Saving & tagging: Pocket
 - × Content curation: Pinterest, Scoop.it
- × **Storage and recovery (organization):**
 - × Saving in the cloud / Social bookmarks: Diigo, Evernote
- × **Strategies to evaluate information:**
 - × Add-ons, tips & tricks to identify fake news, rubrics ...



Tools and strategies to reflect and create/edit information and digital content

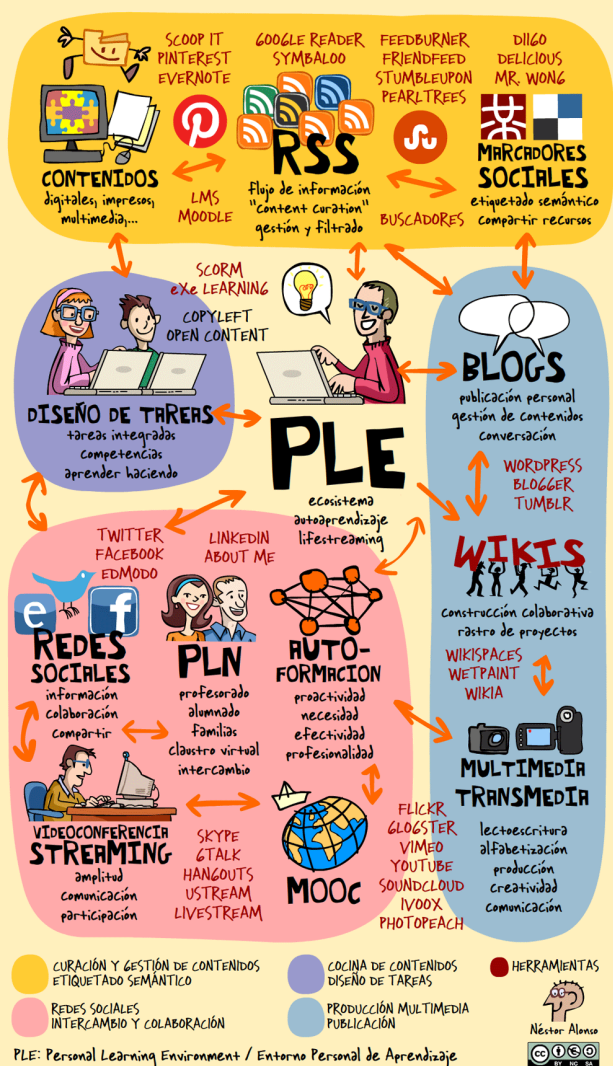
- × All kinds of content creation / editing tools:

 - × Audios, podcasts, videos , videotutorials



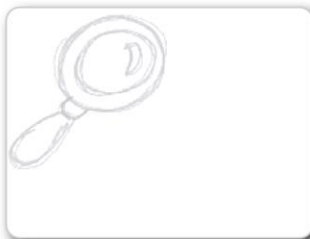

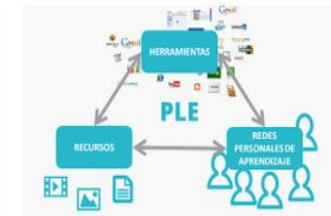


Similar approach with students:

- Creation of a PLE: adapted to different needs/types of professionals (comparison at the beginning and end of the subject /training)
- Creation of a plan for lifelong learning guided by questions
- Creation of a portfolio to collect evidence of learning
- Importance of digital identity
